A YEAR IN REVIEW

In 2023, Teach For Kosova continued its Fellowship program with 15 new Fellows, representing our 4th Cohort, and implemented community-based projects as well as events throughout the year.






Highlights form 2023:

- Recruited our fourth Cohort of Fellows:
 86.67% were girls and 13.33% were from minority communities.
- In cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, we organized a discussion on the topic "How can the Diaspora support the development of education in Kosova?"
- We successfully completed the project "Promoting Critical Thinking and Multi-Ethnic Cohesion among Youth," which was supported by the National Endowment for Democracy.
- The Second (2021) Cohort of Teach For Kosova completed the program. The
 16 Fellows who graduated became part of the TFK Alumni Movement.
- We held our annual Summer School in partnership with the Municipality of Prishtina, for the third year in a row.
- We developed projects together with the US Embassy, Teach For All, and the Danish Refugee Council (DRC) to facilitate after-school learning and provide supplementary lessons for students.

THE FOURTH COHORT


In 2023, Teach For Kosova recruited, trained and deployed the Fourth Cohort of 15 exceptional young leaders. We continue to recruit and expand our program, with Fellows who will work for two years in education during our Fellowship and develop collective leadership to create systemic change.

The Teach For Kosova summer institute provided me with the opportunity to immerse myself in the art of teaching.



2023 SUMMER INSTITUTE A CLOSER LOOK

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- 15 Fellows completed our 5-week Institute Program.
- Topics ranged from deeper recognition of the inequalities in Kosova's education system, to fighting and advocating for those inequalities, all through the development of Fellows as teacher-leaders.
- In our post-institute survey, 100% of Fellows responded 10/10 when asked if they would recommend the Fellowship program to a friend.

2023 SUMMER SCHOOL A CLOSER LOOK

- As part of our Summer Institute, Teach For Kosova organized the third edition of our annual summer school.
- Summer School is designed to provide a free, fun and informative summer program for children in Kosova.
- As part of their training, Fellows were tasked with planning 15 days of summer school for children from Prishtina and Fushë Kosova.







Summer school dates: July 10 - 28, 2023

- The Summer School included a total of 130 children, 80 of whom were ethnically Albanian, and 50 students from the Roma, Ashkali, and Egyptian communities.
- The children had 15 days of learning, including three days of activities held entirely outside and in nature.
- The subjects covered during the Summer School included "Critical Thinking through Books and Movies," "Psychology of Emotion Regulation," "Physics through Experiments," "Media Education," and many others.







MONTHLY TRAINING SESSIONS A CLOSER LOOK

Throughout 2023, the Teach For Kosova program team has continuously organized monthly thematic trainings, with the aim of developing and supporting our Fellows to become teacher-leaders in their communities.

First year of Fellowship

Topics such as "Vision-oriented learning," "Families and classrooms: Building effective relationships for the socio-emotional development of students," and "Student assessment and the design of summative tests according to Bloom's taxonomy" are some of the topics during our monthly trainings with 2023 Fellows.

They have created their classroom visions together with their students, and are working with them every day to reinforce and improve teaching practices, cultivate a sense of belonging, and develop leadership skills in the classroom and beyond.

Second year of Fellowship

With our 2022 Fellows who are completing their second year, the program team has developed monthly thematic trainings to support them in further strengthening their leadership skills and advocacy for education and society in the communities where they operate.

Trainings such as "Theory of change and theory of leadership," "Teaching as collective leadership," "Writing grant-based projects," and "How to Access to Municipal Directorates of Education" are just some of the topics that have contributed to the efforts of Teach For Kosova to address inequalities, prepare future leaders who advocate for quality education, and have a positive impact on the development of society.

Following this journey, we will continue to work with passion and dedication to ensure quality education for all students in Kosova and to help build a fairer and more equal society for all.

FUTURE OF EDUCATION PROJECT

2023 represented the second year of Teach For Kosova's "Future of Education" project. Through this initiative, supported by Teach For All, TFK has had one goal: to co-design and pilot a new system of teacher performance assessment for the Republic of Kosova – one that is inclusive, fair, and yields actionable results.

Because Teacher Performance Assessment (TPA) is often a contentious topic in Kosova, TFK sees this project as one of our most ambitious endeavors to have a direct impact on the education system. During the first year of the project, we worked with the Municipalities of Prishtina, Prizren, Mitrovica, Ferizaj, and Podujeva to develop instruments for teacher assessment. After developing the instruments, Teach For Kosova piloted the new assessment method with 10 of our own Fellows.

During the second half of 2023, we selected 25 schools and 500 teachers who will now be a part of our larger pilot project. Additionally, we signed memoranda of understanding with each Municipality for the second year of our project.

Looking ahead to 2024, Teach For Kosova is eagerly awaiting implementing our assessment with 500 teachers. By the end of the project, we hope to gain valuable insight into our instruments, and eventually align this project to Kosova's national system of performnace assessment.











PROMOTING CRITICAL THINKING AND MULTI-ETHNIC COHESION AMONGST YOUTH

At the end of 2023, Teach For Kosova, with the support of the National Endowment for Democracy, successfully completed the project "Promotion of Critical Thinking and Multi-Ethnic Cohesion amongst youth" which was carried out in 5 municipalities throughout Kosova: Skenderaj, Lipjan, Podujeva, Shtime, and Gjakova.

In these municipalities, we partnered with 10 vocational and traditional high schools where 5 Fellows of the 2022 Cohort worked with 200 to develop their critical thinking and civic activism.

The students of these schools demonstrated their passion for bringing positive changes to the community where they live through debates and open discussions.

The topics addressed were diverse and important for their development as individuals and for society: from the fight against bullying and prejudice to self-awareness and gender equality. The students showed courage and ingenuity in tackling sensitive issues such as youth migration and sexual harassment.

A special part of the project was the organization of 'Living Libraries' by the students of Debate Clubs in each municipality, where they had the opportunity to discuss with 'Living Books' about their motivation, success, and challenges they faced on their way to a brighter future.

In the last activity of the project, the students met with the mayors of their municipalities in public hearings. They discussed with their mayors in an informal setting and presented their requests and hopes to improve the community where they live.















INCREASING ACCESS AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR KOSOVA'S CHILDREN

Teach For Kosova in cooperation with the US Embassy in Kosova, is implementing the project "Increasing access and opportunities for Kosova's children" which aims to address inequalities in education and create inclusive learning environments.

Within the Teach For Kosova project, we first worked with local directorates of education to find partner schools.

The selected schools included "Fazli Greiçevci" Primary School in Mitrovica, "Ulpiana" High School in Gadime, Lipjan, "Naim Frashëri" Primary School in Zaskok, Ferizaj, and "Hivzi Sylejmani" High School in Fushë Kosova. These school were initially provided with equipemnt such as laptops, projectors, printers, English language books, reading corners, flipc harts, and didactic materials, with the goal of transforming them into inclusive education spaces.

We also designed and implemented additional lessons adapted to the needs of students from marginalized groups.

Through the support of Teach For Kosova Fellows and the program team, curricula with attractive content were developed, including various subjects such as Inclusive Sports, Food Engineering, English Language, and Media Education.

These subjects not only offered academic enrichment but also promoted diversity, gender equality, and social cohesion for over 160 students in these 4 municipalities.

With active student participation, including balanced gender distribution and multi-ethnic representation, the impact of these initiatives is sizeable.













DISCUSSION: HOW CAN THE DIASPORA SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF EDUCATION IN KOSOVA?

Within our Summer Institute this year, in cooperation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Diaspora, a discussion was held about the participation and potential of education leaders from the Diaspora in the process of education development in Kosova.

The discussion aimed to identify ways to increase the involvement of the diaspora in Kosova's education sector.

During this meeting, members of the diaspora presented suggestions and attitudes regarding how they can contribute more actively to the advancement of education in Kosova. In particular, the need for further investment in literacy, and the creation of a education program for applied behaviorial analysis (ABA) in the context of education were emphasized.

Egzon Gashi, Executive Director of Teach For Kosova, emphasized the organizations intention to bring the contribution of the diaspora to the most sensitive parts of Kosovo's society, highlighting the importance of their involvement in education specifically.

Several experts in education from the diaspora participated in the discussion, including Suzana Aliu, a teacher of Swedish and English Language at a school in the capital of Sweden, who emphasized the importance of reading and comprehension for Kosova students.

Additionally, Tringë Krasniqi-Gashi, a teacher of children with autism in the United States of America, and professor of special education Gjergj Haxhiu from the USA, highlighted the need for the use of behavior analysis in every elementary and secondary school as a tool to support the development of children with special needs.

Overall, it was obvious that the involvement of the diaspora in the development of education in Kosova represents an important opportunity for the advancement and improvement of the education system in the country. The strategies and suggestions presented in this discussion will serve as a guide for the next steps for the inclusion and contribution of the diaspora in this direction.











EMPOWERING YOUNG TEACHERS FROM ROMA, ASHKALI AND EGYPTIAN COMMUNITIES

Throughout Kosova, workshops were held in eight public schools aimed at bringing out best practices of teaching for inclusion in education.

Fellows from the 2023 Cohort of Teach For Kosova, along with teachers, collaborated to create activities for an inclusive education catalog. These activities will be included in the catalog for inclusive education, providing a collection of up-to-date techniques and methods for teaching and working with children - with a particular emphasis on our children from underserved communities.

Multiple activities were developed by ten teachers from each school. These activities will be part of the catalog for inclusive education, which will be published and distributed to all schools in Kosova in 2025, containing over 200 activities for inclusive education.

These workshops were conducted in eight partner municipalities: Podujevë, Prizren, Deçan, Suharekë, Kaçanik, Ferizaj, Mitrovica, and Vushtrri.

We extend our gratitude to the teachers for their very fruitful and impressive collaboration in these workshops. The schools included in this collaboration were Destan Bajraktari Primary School, SHFMU "Mati Logoreci," SHFMU "Shefki Kuleta" in Tërrnave, SHFMU "Naim Frashëri," SHFMU "Lidhja e Prizren" in Deçan, School "Anton Z. Cajupi," School "Fazli Greiçevci" in Shipol, and SHFMU Kadri Zeka in Dubrava, Kaçanik.

Additionally, supported by this project, 50 students from the Roma, Ashkali, and Egyptian communities participated in #SummerSchool2023. These students engaged in a wide range of activities designed to promote education, socialization, and fun.















LET GIRLS THRIVE

With support from Teach For All, in 2023, we began implementing the multi-year project "Let Girls Thrive," which aims to address some of the main challenges of social cohesion faced by girls, and especially those from marginalized groups, in Kosova.

We are implementing the "Let Girls Thrive" project in partnership with the NGO QIKA, where we first codesigned a comprehensive training session during our Summer Institute. During this training, we worked with Fellows of the 2023 Cohort, introducing them to the importance of including a gender perspective in teaching.

In the session, Fellows were introduced to the basic concepts of gender equality and existing inequalities in Kosova, with a special emphasis on the education sector. This experience has helped Fellows engage and advance gender and social equality as teachers.

Beginning in September, we began monthly training sessions with 5 Fellows of the 2023 Cohort engaged in this projectorThroughout the project, Fellows will teach in Kosova's public schools. During monthly trainings, these Fellows receive advanced training on the information needed and tools required to infuse the perspective of gender equality in teaching - no matter which subject they teach.

We have also formed girls' and boys' clubs in the 5 partner municipalities in this project: Suharekë, Lipjan, Vushtrri, Prizren, and Ferizaj. Fellows are working with over 75 students in selected schools on issues such as gender-based violence, career guidance, property rights, gender-based discrimination, and many other topics.

2023 is the first year of this project, which will include three years and has the ultimate goal of creating an elective subject for girls' education.

Together, Teach For Kosova, QIKA, and our Fellows are driving tangible change, challenging norms, and laying the groundwork for a more inclusive and equitable future for girls and boys.













TEACH FOR KOSOVA ALUMNI

Our alumni actively identify educational challenges, raise awareness in themselves and others, and collaboratively adopt solutions. These graduates are not only educators; they are activists who tirelessly advocate for an equal and comprehensive education system in Kosova.







We aim to develop our alumni through three pathways:

- School leadership;
- Public policy (municipaland ministerial);
- Social Enterprises.

Alumni Movement

In 2023, the TKF Alumni Movement welcomed 16 Fellows from the 2021 Cohort who successfully completed the two-year Fellowship of Teach For Kosova in June.

Teach For Kosova now has 29 active Alumni as part of the Movement.

Global Alumni

Teach For Kosova, together with 62 other countries around the world, is part of the global network of Teach For All, which is profoundly changing the field of education.

Valmira Morina, a Fellow of the First (2020) Cohort and Alumna of Teach For Kosova, had the opportunity to participate in a 1-year Fellowship at Teach For All for Leadership in Education, becoming part of the first generation of the European Alumni Leadership Fellowship.

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







